CHARITY GOVERNANCE

GOVERNING DOCUMENT

We are a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation and regulated by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator. As such charity law requires that we maintain a governing document and it takes the form of a constitution. This is enhanced by a number of policies that we have developed to accompany our constitution. Some of our policies are accessible on our website alongside our constitution.

THE BOARD

We are a membership organisation and as such we consult our members and take direction from them regarding charity governance. The leadership of the charity is the responsibility of the board who are elected annually at an annual general meeting. Board members consist of officeholders and trustees. It is the responsibility of our board members to make sure we are meeting our charitable aims and objectives.

APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

Appointment of Trustees is the responsibility of the current sitting board who elect new trustees upon receipt of an application to become a trustee. Once a new trustee is appointed the membership, they are invited to participate in a vote of investiture within a 4 week period of appointment.

Due to the regulatory changes requiring the registration of all charity trustees, we are in the process of our trustee selection system and will be updating our constitution in due course to reflect these changes.

CHARITY AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

About us

We are a youth charity run by young people with a dedicated board. We bridge the gap between young people and the decision making process both locally and at the national level.

We have worked with various third sector organisations and partners such as:

Our Aims & Objectives

We cover the entirety of the local authority area and as such we act as an umbrella organisation helping to represent, support and promote smaller youth voice groups/youth groups through our affiliate membership scheme.

Our History

Since RYV began in 2003, we have served as a youth forum and continue to do so today.

We were originally a space for Renfrewshire's elected Members of the Scottish Youth Parliament to meet with the young folk of Renfrewshire, almost like a surgery.

We have since then grown into the widereaching organisation we are today, our mission being to bridge the gap between the young people of Renfrewshire and the decision making processes that impact their lives.

- To facilitate and organise activites for young people aged 12-25, who either live or regularly use services in Renfrewshire.
- To provide young people with a safe and friendly environment where they can participate in youth voice activities to ensure they have a say in decisions within the local area.
- To equip young people with soft-skills such as teamwork, organisational skills and improving their self-esteem and confidence.
- To alleviate the effects of poverty amongst young people, by promoting a culture of inclusion and tackling any forms of discrimination.
- To work with local organisations, business and the local authority in the best interests of young people.





Members of the Scottish Youth Parliament (MSYP) Update



WHAT IS IT?

The Scottish Youth Parliament represents Scotland's young people, advocating for their participation in shaping the nation. Locally, MSYPs are supported by Youth Services, which provide training, personal development, and empowerment, promoting democratic literacy through a youth work ethos.

HIGHLIGHTS

- MSYP's have been able to tie into RYV on events and activities like the Residential, Band Night and Youth Assembly.
- MSYP's attended National Sittings in Stirling and Aberdeen on workshops that allowed them to gain key skills for roles and build partnerships.
- MSYP's undertake training and support to carry our local and national work.
- MSYP's consult with young people about local issues based on motions that are put forward.
- Isla Grimes MSYP puts forward motion on LGBT+ Education at Stirling Sitting.
- Daniela Onyewuenyi becomes Trustee at Scottish Youth Parliaments and Renfrewshire Youth Voice.





WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR RYV?

MSYPs connect RYV to the Scottish Youth Parliament and decision-makers, helping improve outcomes for young people. Integrated into RYV or Erskine Youth Council, they work on consultations, campaigns, and events. Renfrewshire has 5 MSYPs, each representing a geographical area to engage with local constituents.

POSITIVE ABOUT YOUTH AWARDS (PAY)

Recently, we had the 12th Annual Positive About Youth Awards (PAY), this amazing event is a way to show our appreciation to young people that have done a great amount of good deeds in their community by having a positive impact.

This has been done by young people volunteering their time, especially those who go unrecognised for the work they are doing. This event is to show how much young people actually do across Renfrewshire. It was amazing and refreshing to see dedicated young people all together in one place to celebrate their achievements.

This year, the event was held at the Normandy Hotel, and over 150 people turned up to show their gratitude and support on the incredible young talent in our community. The atmosphere was full of excitement, with proud families, friends, and community members all gathered together to honour these awesome individuals.

There were 26 nominations in total, all submitted through a network of partnership organisations. After a lot of careful review, the nominations were sorted into six award categories. nine winners were chosen, along with 10 runners-up, and everyone who was nominated showed outstanding dedication, passion, and determination. Whether you won or were a runner-up, it was clear that young people are making huge contributions to our community.

The Positive About Youth Awards were created to push back against the negative stereotypes of young people often shown in the media. The event gave us all a platform to highlight the great work we do and remind everyone that we're not just the leaders of tomorrow – we're also making a difference today. The ceremony was a brilliant reminder that young people's hard work and achievements should always be celebrated and recognised.





Renfrewshire Youth Voice Bored Meetings? Training Evaluation

What is it?

Bored Meetings? Not here! This was an interactive programme we got stuck into, where we take part in loads of practical activities. It's all about helping us build confidence, take the lead, and learn the skills we need to be part of a youth forum or board. It's hands-on, empowering, and gives us the tools to make our voices heard where it matters.

Why did we do it?

We felt it was important to undertake this training to improve how we run as a group, particularly in understanding our roles, how to take part in decision-making and how to manage any tasks or issues that arise.



From our training:

Agree that we're encouraged to ask questions in meetings, the language is easy to understand, and we know when we're there to speak up for others and get the support we need to do that properly.

Agree that it's clear how and when decisions are made, we're kept in the loop about what's been decided, everyone impacted finds out what's going on, and our involvement is checked regularly to make sure our opinions actually count.

CASE STUDY: NIGHT AT THE BUNGALOW

Free music event hosted by Renfrewshire Youth Voice, in partnership with The Bungalow.

BACKGROUND

As part of our work, we had noticed a gap in the amount of free activities which young people could attend in the local area. We thought that hosting a band night would be a popular event - as it would allow young people to experience the local talent in a safe and welcoming environment.

We sought out "The Bungalow" as it is a social enterprise as well as an established music venue in the local area which we believed it would be ideal for our event!

After confirming the venue we began our search for performers – we ended up with a great mix of both bands and solo performers with a colourful variety of genres on display.

WHAT HAPPENED

This event was great for us to work as a team and really take the lead in organising a free event that any young person in Renfrewshire could attend, we had 7 performers who had the chance to shine on the night.

We were blown away with the popularity of the event as 140 young people attended, the overall atmosphere was relaxed and enjoyable. We think attendees had a great time, this would be encouraging if we ran this event again.

The staff at the bungalow were amazing in helping us to pull the event together, by giving us the venue and staff costs in kind. This helped us to get the most out of our budget and ensure the event was as as inclusive and welcoming as possible.

The popularity of this event has shown the appetite amongst local young people who would like more events like this to happen, this is something we would welcome and be happy to host again and are already looking at plans for next year. This kind of event also helps us to get a wider reach of young people and spread the word about the work we are doing, as well as seeing if anyone would be interested to join RYV.



THE CHALLENGES

For us the challenges were focused on:

- Spreading the workload amongst all members.
- Making sure the schedule of bands were on time and equal.
- Adding more tables and chairs to accommodate more people.
- Sharing the event on wider channels and promotion of bands.
- Building and enriching our partnership with The Bungalow.

NEXT STEPS

We are looking to host this event again in the summer of 2025 and we are hoping to make it bigger and better this year, using the skills we have learned from this year.



Partnership working with Renfrewshire Council Youth Team

Renfrewshire Youth Voice (RYV) was established in 2003 in response to the absence of formal structures enabling young people to express their views across the Renfrewshire area. The organisation was created to ensure that young people have a meaningful voice in local decision-making.

Since its inception, RYV has developed significantly. Furthermore, we hope to once again celebrate the wonderful achievements of the youth of Renfrewshire by hosting our 13th Annual **Positive About Youth Awards** later in the year.

We always look forward to this event, even more so with the addition of working with Engage Renfrewshire to present the **Saltire Summit Awards** on the night and with the privilege of hosting even more young preformers.
